<u>Unit 5</u>

- *Analyzing word structure*: Root words, affixes
- Asking about and expressing present and past ability: Modal auxiliaries
- Asking and answering questions: Questions with "what" sentence structures; "wh" questions; regular and irregular past tense questions and answers; object pronouns
- *Classifying*: Present tense verbs, conjunctions
- *Comparing and contrasting*: Adjectives, comparative form
- *Connecting ideas*: Conjunctions, prepositions
- Describing actions and states of being: Regular and irregular past tense verbs
- Describing how, how often, how much, and when: Adverbs
- *Describing people and things*: Adjectives, figurative language
- Describing people, things, and events of the past: Statements with there was/there were
- *Describing what kind*: Adjectives, synonyms, antonyms

- *Confirming predictions*: Past and present tense verbs
