At LEVEL A, a student can:

1. identify classroom objects, common shapes, common pets, and clothing.
2. use present tense verb “to be.”
3. use regular plurals.
4. follow simple directions involving basic positions.

At LEVEL B, a student can:

1. identify common household items, tools, and foods.
2. name the days of the week.
3. express himself or herself using the present and future tenses of common verbs.
4. use irregular plurals and negatives correctly.
5. understand descriptions of relative quantity.
6. ask present tense questions.

At LEVEL C, a student can:

1. understand and use ordinal numbers correctly.
2. identify parts of a house.
3. understand and tell time using idiomatic expressions as needed.
4. use possessives and possessive pronouns correctly.
5. understand and express comparative concepts.
6. use present tense contractions correctly.
7. describe the main properties of ordinary objects.
8. express himself or herself using the past tense.
9. comprehend and express major facts of a simple story.

At LEVEL D, a student can:

1. name the months of the year.
2. understand and name opposites of key words.
3. understand and name career fields.
4. understand and explain the meaning of prefixes.
5. narrate preferred activities.
6. use reflexive pronouns correctly.
7. use irregular past tense correctly.
8. use conditional and conditional perfect tenses correctly.
9. evaluate a situation in a story and choose appropriate action for a character.

At LEVEL E, a student can:

1. name and understand the value of money.
2. ask questions appropriate for an interview.
3. use compound sentences correctly.
4. understand and explain the meaning of common suffixes.
5. use reciprocal pronouns correctly.
6. ask past tense questions.
7. use object pronouns correctly.
8. express himself or herself using past perfect tense correctly.
9. use past tense contractions correctly.
10. comprehend and offer a logical conclusion for a story.
11. understand and identify characters’ feelings in a simple story.

At LEVEL F, a student can:

1. classify and identify animals using science concepts.
2. explain word meanings.
3. understand and interpret graphs.
4. name opposites of more abstract and difficult words.
5. understand and use the passive voice.
6. use complex sentences correctly.
7. evaluate a situation in a story and choose appropriate action.
8. justify choice of action in a story.
9. convey story ideas in own words.

Note: This Test Level Summary is a list of competencies that are assessed by the IPT II–Oral English Test. There may be only one test item in the test assessing a given skill. The Test Level Summary is simply an indicator of the oral language competencies the student possesses.
